Mount Barker Bible Expo

Based on materials originally developed by the Mount Waverly ecclesia, the Mount Barker Ecclesia's *Bible Expo* covers a range of topics. The section *From Texts to Translation* traces the Bible text from its earliest forms to the present day. There is a section on Bible Archaeology and another, *The Story of the Bible*, deals with the overall story line of the Bible record from Genesis to Revelation. Other areas covered include Bible prophecy, environmental issues, Jesus Christ and the Kingdom of God. This latter section has a model of Ezekiel's temple.

The Living Word Exhibition

The centrepiece is a reproduction of the complete Isaiah Scroll discovered at the Dead Sea in 1947. There are replicas of the Taylor Prism and Cyrus Cylinder and there is an actual Babylonian seal. There are also a selection of coins from New Testament times, including a Judea Capta coin minted in A.D. 72 by Vespasian. Amongst other things there are artefacts relating to the Nazi persecution of the Jews, including a "Yellow Star" badge.

Rome, Jerusalem and the Bible

This exhibition provides a witness to 2000 years of history and Bible prophecy. It includes replicas of ancient inscriptions based on the originals in the British Museum. There is a 1537 second edition of the Miles Coverdale Bible, the first complete English Bible (this Bible is in the care of the Victoria ecclesia (B.C. Canada) but they kindly loan it out to exhibitions). There is also a 1607 Geneva Bible. Other interesting items include books written by men such as Sir Isaac Newton in which the return of the Jews to the Land was predicted hundreds of years before the event.

The Bible Exhibition

This exhibition is divided into three parts. The first part covers God's plan revealed in the Bible and deals particularly with the wonders of creation and the origin of sin and death. The second section deals with why the Bible can be trusted. There is an extensive range of Bibles, including a sixteenth-century A.D. Hebrew scroll and a facsimile of the Codex Alexandrinus. There is also a 1613 copy of the King James Version. Archaeological evidence is presented, including some actual remains, such as an ivory fragment from Samaria. Replicas include a copy of the Rosetta Stone. There are also numerous coins and stamps. The final section in the exhibition is about the invitation which God extends to people. This section includes some of the main Bible doctrines.

The Bible Today

The "Bible Today" exhibition consists of nine illustrated and illuminated panels.
